DENMAN ISLAND ARTS AND CRAFTS SOCIETY

This Society was formed four years ago by a group of Denman Islanders, whose goal was to create an organization to help Island crafts. Four years ago the intention was to purchase the old motel units and convert them into a cultural center offering retail space, studio areas and above all space for workshops (for classes in a wide variety of disciplines). These energetic plans faded from the horizon as the federal grants dried up - a result of a change in government in Ottawa.

Today the Society is still alive and the goals remain unchanged. The center of attention now is the possible lease of the "old" school once the new one is completed. One only has to look at what was done with the old school house in Qualicum to imagine something like this on Denman. At present the Arts and Crafts Society is actively involved in fund raising (have applied for a federal tax number), and will be operating a public art gallery this summer and has taken over Studio III Art School, offering a wide range of classes this summer.

The first major fund raiser was the Artists' Ball on New Years Eve (to be a yearly event) and the second major fund raiser is a Klondike Theme dance this month.

I hope that the above information has helped to clear up who we are, what we are and where we would like to be. It will take thousands of hours of work to achieve a facility that can operate as the Denman Island Cultural Center but to those of us now involved, it is not only a realistic goal, but a worthwhile community project that can only benefit the island now and in the future.

Burning permits are now required. They are available at the firehall on Thursday nights from 6:30 - 7 PM and Saturday mornings from 9:30 - 10 AM. These permits are necessary to keep people informed on critical weather conditions, safe fire methods and probably most important, they prevent costly false alarms turned in by neighbors or passers-by concerned about a fire they have spotted or can smell! This is a good time of year to review your own precautions for a fire. Remember, if there is a fire in your house, the electricity to your pump will probably be cut off. This leaves you with either buckets from your well or rain barrels, or a gas powered portable pump. Small fires in the house that cannot be handled by your fire extinguisher (which you have in a convenient spot!) can be handled by your garden hose. If you are burning outside, set the hose up before you start. By the time a hose is untangled and connected, your fire may be beyond your control.

Did you know?..We have an RCMP detachment serving Denman and Hornby Islands. Constable Robinson is in charge of this detachment and will be stationed on Hornby with Constable Kosloski until September 30. These officers are living on Hornby and will be patrolling both Islands. Emergency calls will still go to Courtenay, but our detachment will be available on pager or portable at all times. If we have an emergency on Denman after ferry hours, they will be able to get here by boat without having to call out the Hornby ferry. The detachment has a temporary office on Hornby until next month when they are expecting a large trailer to be set up as an office. There had been a rash of breaking and entering crimes here on Denman and on Hornby and a male has been apprehended already. I know that I feel safer!

- TO: DENMAN ISLAND TRUSTEES FROM: ROBYN ADDISON
- Re: Staff report of public meeting held on Denman Island May 4, 1988 to discuss the removal by Lands Branch of the public reserve designation on vacant Crown land.
- Background: The proposed Official Community Plan for Denman Island has a central theme of the preservation of wild areas for passive recreation use and for maintaining the rural atmosphere. The visual character of the island is something of an illusion because the forestry lands appear as free space natural areas. They can be logged and developed however, thus removing that visual component. The plan relies on what little vacant Crown land exists to provide park, trail and greenspace opportunities.

The May 4th meeting on Denman Island was to hear the feelings of the public to the loss of the UREP status on the vacant Crown land and to devise a strategy for reacting to the change.

Concensus Position That all of the vacant Crown land on Denman Island should be designated immediately as open space park land and that detailed plans for connecting walking trails, parking areas and picnic areas through and within these lands shall be developed over time as the need arises.

Ratio

- The Provincial Parks publicly defined objective is to have 6% of land dedicated to public uses by 1992. The combined total of proposed and existing park and the vacant Crown land is not as high as 6%.
- Denman Island is a destination for people of the Province to enjoy a recreational experience making it necessary to ensure there are public areas available.
- The park reserves provide "pocket wilderness" experiences as distinctive ecosystems for passive enjoyment and educational opportunities.
- 4. About 50% of developed privately held land is vacant indicating there is no shortage of development opportunities within the private sector.
- 5. Both Parks Branch and the Regional District have indicated an interest in Boyle Point as a park. Now that it is destined to be a Provincial park there remains a need for a regional park. The two categories of park have different functions and client groups and one does not preclude the other.
- 6. It is the opinion of the residents of the Island that Denman is sadly under supplied with public land. The privately held forest land gives an impression of open spaces that is not real nor permanent.
- Strategy That a letter to the Minister of Forests and Lands be prepared for the signature of the Chairman of the Islands Trust re-affirming the initial stance of the proposed community plan that all vacant Crown land be reserved for public use and that existing trails be preserved for public use. Further, the letter should indicate that the community is prepared to develop more detailed proposals for differing uses and linkages of trails for the properties over the next two years for eventual inclusion as an addendum to the Official Community Plan.

REFERENDUM INFORMATION

The Ratepayers and Resident Association of Denman Island are sponsoring a referendum to be held in conjunction with upcoming Island Trust elections in early November.

THE REFERENDUM WILL ASK THE VOTERS OF DENMAN ISLAND TO APPROVE AN INCREASE IN TAXES, THE FUNDS COLLECTED TO BE USED TO ASSIST WITH THE OPERATING COSTS OF THE OLD COMMUNITY HALL (DIRCS) AND THE SENIORS ACTIVITY CENTRE -A FIXED TOTAL OF \$8000 : \$4000 TO EACH CENTRE, WHICH CAN ONLY BE CHANGED BY A FUTURE REFERENDUM.

The bylaw allowing for this referendum will be passed Sept. 26 at the Regional District Meeting in Courtenay. The Seniors Centre will present detailed information to their members on October 2 at a special meeting.

Raising dollars by taxation was suggested for many reasons:

volunteers would have time to complete other projects in the buildings if their time was freed up from having to raise basic insurance, heat and light costs.

-most islanders would contribute to the support of the buildings instead of just volunteers.

prices at some activities could be reduced if dollars were automatically raised by taxes.

-monies would be collected from the winter and summer population, as most islanders make use of the buildings or activities of each centre at some time in the year.

-there would be a guaranteed annual base of money so each executive does not have to worry "will we raise enough this year?"

-this spreads the cost of each hall to everyone, given that seniors enjoy activities at the DIRCS hall and people other than Senior members use the Seniors Building (Art Gallery, Museum, Flower Show, etc.).

-enables both centres to build a "nest egg" for emergencies from other raised funds.

-allows each centre to plan for a special project.

Concerns of raising dollars by taxation: -our taxes increase (minimal \$5 - \$40 per household approximately) -the volunteer energy may be reduced. (This is a possibility, may be true, may not be).

-asking for tax dollars is a sign that "we can't do it alone, that we need help". (Some people may view the request in this way. Others will view it as a sign that we are still doing it alone - it is our own money we are collectively raising).

-if we raise money for these buildings, what is to stop other organizations from asking for tax dollars? (Nothing is stopping them - but another referendum would have to be held and you would vote on it).

-why should I pay when I never use either hall? (Some people don't use the halls, but most benefit from their existence - museum for tourists, art gallery for relatives to see, room for provincial elections, fireworks display outside at Halloween, rooms to rent for private weddings, improved land sale potential land sale potential, etc.).

-why should the large landowner pay more than the small parcel owner? (There is an unfairness in this to some people. Regional District is therefore going to only tax the "improvements").

-if the Seniors do not ratify this request for a referendum for their hall to be included, why should they pay for the DIRCS hall that they don't use? (If the Seniors do not agree to raise \$4000 for their own hall, the whole referendum will be cancelled and DIRCS can choose to request their own referendum in the spring).

FURTHER DISCUSSIONS REGARDING THE CONCERNS MENTIONED AT THE SEPTEMBER RATEPAYERS MEETING HAVE OCCURRED. THEREFORE SOME OF THE DETAILS DIFFER (FIXED AMOUNT \$8000, TAXING ONLY IMPROVEMENTS)

THIS IS THE WAY THE REFERENDUM WILL WORK: -Ratepayers will sponsor the referendum, Jack Turner, Regional Director, will present the motion to the Regional District. -The ballot will be printed. We all vote (if over 19 and on the voters list) at the Island Trust elections. -If passed, the money will be received in April, 1989 by each hall.

-The money to be spent on operating costs (heat, light, fuel, insurance, maintenance).

-Ratepayers, as an organization, has no control over either hall. -To ensure input at annual Ratepayers meetings, any adult can become a voting member by paying a \$3 membership fee (a B.C. Government law).

To raise \$8000 annually by taxing improvements (house, barn, well, fences, etc.) you would pay:

SHOULD THEY BE ALLOWED TO VOTE LOCALLY, THEY WILL BE INVITED TO DO SO AND FULL INFORMATION WILL BE SENT TO THEM IN THE FORM OF THIS NEWSLETTER.




UPDATE:


How many of you know that this year, 1989, is the 100th anniversary of the Denman Island Community Church? In 1888, the Rev. Walter Baer established a Methodist congregation and the following year a church was completed on the present property, donated by Bob Swan. The church possesses a pump organ, also donated in 1889. In the first decade of the 1900's, a Rev. William Kid rowed 1 1/2 miles to Hornby Island, cycled to the school house, preached, travelled back again, preached on Denman Island then rowed to Union Bay, preached and rowed home again. All I can say is that we don't quite possess the stamina our ancestors must have had!

The church will be celebrating with numerous events. On May 6th, the UCW will put on a Centennial Luncheon from 11:30 - 2:00PM (Piece de resistance -smoked salmon quiche)sandwiches and goodies will be served -featuring costumed waitresses and an antique display and, hopefully, some special music. Then, on June 10th a reception will be held at the Seniors Centre: on the 11th the 10:30 a.m. service will feature Rev. Henderson, who was pastor on Denman, Union Bay and Cumberland 25 years ago. 


Atthur Pickles and Jimmy Swan, both former students, exchange stories about their school days

Artifacts will be returned upon request, or may be donated to form a permanent display that will be located in the entrance of the new school.




Denman Island School about 1912. The second room was bult in 1919.

Our April Dinner-Dance was a friendly get-together, with "Pot-luck" turning into a sumptuous meal, as usual.





DENMAN ISLAND RATEPAYERS ASSOC. FORESTRY COMMITTEE

Concerned about current and future logging on Denman Island, the Ratepayers Association has recently revived its Forestry Committee. The Committee has met twice and we want to introduce ourselves to the community.

Although the Forestry Committee is not "anti-logging," it is committed to encouraging forestry practices on Denman Island which are sensitive to the ecosystem, responsible toward the future, and compatible with community values which esteem environmental aesthetics and well-being.

In order to facilitate this objective, the Committee has undertaken a variety of tasks. We are educating ourselves with a goal to educating others. We are inventorying and mapping the Denman Island forest resource so we can get a sense of our forest ecosystem as a whole. We are investigating current and proposed legislation, in various jurisdictions, pertaining to logging on private lands to determine whether Denman Island has, or could have, the authority to modify logging practices. We are collecting articles, clippings, briefs, and reports on a variety of forestry-related subjects and intend to make our resource files available to the public in the library. We are making contact with all corporate forest owners on the Island in order to engage them in the work of this committee. We are compiling a list of resource persons who are knowledgeable about the forest ecosystem and are familiar with alternative logging practices which avoid clear cut, are sensitive to the environment, and encourage sustained yield. In addition, we are compiling a list of logging contractors who support alternative practices and are skilled in the implementation of these practices.

We intend to publish a forestry information package outlining logging options and alternatives for people considering logging on their property. We are discussing the idea of sponsoring a "Celebrate Denman Forests Week" which will include such activities as forest walks, a forestry forum, films, and art displays.

Guiding the work of this committee is a deep attachment to the well-being of our forests in an understanding that our planetary survival depends on our learning new ways to think about and be with our fragile environment. We welcome your support. Our next meeting: Thursday, May 4, Jim Pepper's.

#### DENMAN ISLAND COMMUNITY CHURCH 1889 - 1989Centennial Celebrations

Prior to 1888, Worship Services for the Christian Community on Denman Island were held in private homes. These Services being conducted by Presbyterian Ministers, among them being Rev. F.B. McElmon from 1878 to 1883, who came from Comox. In 1888 Rev. W. Baer, a Methodist Minister from Eastern Canada, came with his wife to reside on the Island. In that same year he conducted a number of Revival Meetings and on Dec. 26th, 1888 Rev. Hill came from Nanaimo to officially constitute the Christian Community on Denman Island as a Congregation of the Methodist Church of Canada. In 1889 Mr. Robert Swan donated a parcel of land on Denman Road on which was built in that year the present church building. Also in 1889 a beautiful walnut encased foot-pedal organ was donated by Mrs. Nixon. This organ is still played on special occasions. A copy of the King James Version of the Bible, which was used by the home groups prior to 1889, is also in the present church building.

To celebrate the building of the church in 1889 a number of special events are scheduled for 1989, among them being:-

- May 6th: 11:30 am to 2:00 pm: A Plant Sale and Centennial Luncheon at a cost of \$4.00 for adults and \$2.00 for children. This will be held in the facilities and grounds of the church. It is hoped to have costumed waitresses serving the lunch. (Smoked salmon quiche, sandwiches, goodies).
- June 10th:12:00 noon and following: An Unveiling and Dedication of a Centennial Plaque by Their Honours, The Lieutenant-Governor and Mrs. David Lam; also by the Rev. Murray Henderson who was the Pastor of this congregation from 1959 to 1964. This ceremony at the church will be followed by an informal reception for Their Honours, and light refreshments in the Seniors Complex.
- June 10th:8:00 pm: The Co-Val Choristers, directed by Mrs. Beryl Regier, will give a presentation in narration and song highlighting the early history of Denman Island Community Church. Due to lack of space at the church this also will be in the Seniors Hall. Donations will be received that evening to off-set the cost of the visiting Choristers.
- June 11th:10:30 am: A special Service of Re-Dedication will be held in the church conducted by the Rev. Murray Henderson and Mrs. Freda Edmondson, the present laypastor of the congregation. This will be followed by a Congregational Re-Union Picnic Lunch in the church grounds and facilities. (In case of inclement weather the Re-Union Picnic will be held at the Seniors Centre).

We hope that families of the congregation and all persons who are interested will plan to join in these Centennial Celebrations.

#### NEW ISLANDS TRUST ACT

Victoria - Municipal Affairs Minister Rita Johnston introduced a new Islands Trust Act in the legislature July 1989. It confirms the Trust's mandate to preserve and protect the Trust area and strengthens its ability to do so.

Highlights of the legislation include: * Provisions for the adoption of a trust policy to guide planning and development approvals by local and provincial agencies. * Provisions for membership of new municipalities on the Trust Council, enabling the Trust to regulate the use and development of land and requiring community plans to be consistent with Trust policy.

* Provisions for the establishment of a Trust Fund Board, giving it a clear mandate and budgetary and staff support through the Trust Council and the Minister of Municipal Affairs, Recreation and Culture.

* Clear definition of the roles and responsibilities of the Trust Council, Executive Committee, Local Trust Committees and increased administrative autonomy.

* Clear separation of local responsibilities and provincial interests.

* Transfer to the trust of employees currently assigned to support the Trust program by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs, Recreation and Culture.

* Full responsibility for future staffing.

* Fiscal autonomy for budget determination and management subject to ministerial approval only.





Zoning regulations shall incorporate the following categories of home occupations with consideration being given to parcel

Home occupations permitted on any parcel of land provided it is conducted entirely within a dwelling and limited to services such

i)Home occupations permitted on any parcel 1 hectare or over that can be conducted within a residence or accessory building. ii) Home occupations within this category shall include such uses as private offices, studios, day-care, bed and breakfast, retail agriculture, home appliance repair and food processing. iii)Setbacks, parking and floor space and other regulations shall be adopted by regulation in recognition/concern of the impact

Rule and love and basic sanitation. Ecology and politics and sane living.



community hall renovations !

With the help of a Federal Employment Grant and a B.C. Provincial Lottery Grant, the community hall is about to undergo 4.5 months of reconstruction. Work will begin in earnest August 21st and end Dec. 31. We have had the advice and help of local professionals, Les Baker (architect) and Nelson Hepburn (engineer), and lengthy design discussions and work by Larry Lepore (builder). Victor Sylvan, president of DIRCS last year, initiated the idea and Leslie Dunsmore worked in drafting the proposal in detail after lengthy discussions and planning with Victor and Larry.

#### The major changes will be:

1. To the "main front gym", and will include lifting the central section of the roof and raising/trussing.it to accomodate a fullsize stage where the existing pre-school is situated. This hall will serve Denman Island as a performance and dance centre (similar to Hornby Island's) with improved seating, a refinished floor and improved entrance/exit areas. The stage will have a full dressing room. A light-system will be mounted in the hall. 2. The pre-school will move to the existing library space (with improvements) and will also use the existing "dressing room". 3. The present library will move to a brand new room, (opening directly onto Northwest Road) with large windows and a public door separate from the main hall.

4. A full septic field will be laid behind the tennis courts, and has been approved by the Health Department. 5. A potable water system is also going to be created.





The Annual Foot race drew a crowd with contestants of all ages taking part. Our apologies for the conflict in timing with the auction.



USE IT UP ... WEAR IT OUT ... MAKE IT DO ... OR DO WITHOUT The recycling Committee is making progress in the development of a drop-off spot for our plastic, tin and glass garbage. Please start sorting these items into separate containers at home so that you are ready to take advantage of our local drop-off spot as soon as it is ready. It doesn't take much space in order to collect these items for recycling.

1. TIN & ALUMINUM - should be separated. Wash and remove any labels. Remove ends from tins and flatten. These items take very little room when prepared this way.

- separate into <u>soft</u> (bags, saran wrap) or 2. PLASTICS hard (bottles and containers which can't be reused).

- washed, labels removed and separated into 3. GLASS clear, brown or green.

There are many throwaway items which may be of use to someone else on our island. For example, Richard McGuigan, local apple grower, needs 2 and 4 litre wine bottles for his business. If you have a need for a certain item or items which others might throw away, let islanders know by advertising on the local bulletin board at the store or by placing a very inexpensive ad in this Newsletter. There will be no charge for an ad to give something away. TAKE A POSITIVE STEP IN CLEANING UP OUR ENVIRONMENT BY: - telling your supermarket manager you won't buy products which have been overpackaged and write to the chain with the same message. Then cut down on packaging as much as possible. eg: use rolled oats in bulk rather than expensive packaged cereals. A family of 4 each having a bowl of Cheerios a day spends approx. \$320.00 per year whereas the bulk rolled oats costs approx. \$75.00 and is much more nutritious. - make your own all-purpose cleaner with -

100 ml ammonia

100 ml white vinegar

50 ml baking soda

2 litres of water

If you find you are discussing the same issue over and over again with your spouse or your children; if you prefer to not talk about some of the things that bother you; if you respond quickly when angry and regret your actions later; if you scratch your head wondering "why is this discussion so difficult?" - then come to a ONE-DAY workshop about CONFLICT AND YOU.

You will also look at why your method works one day and not the next AND what you can do about it. There will be time for discussion and practice (if you feel comfortable).

Both facilitators are mediators and facilitate workshops in conflict resolution throughout the year.

Two by-laws have recently received 3rd reading and will be sent to the Minister of Municipal Affairs for approval. Following approval, the by-laws are brought back to the Denman Trust for reconsideration and final adoption.

<u>By-Law 40</u> - "A by-law to establish regulations and By-Law 42 - This is a by-law for subdivision for relatives'

requirements respecting the use of buildings and structures and the use and subdivision of land." This is a consolidation and updating of previous zoning and subdivision regulatory by-laws. residence under Section 996 (4) of the Municipal Act. In line with a Trust council resolution for the Trust area the regulations restrict the minimum parcel size that may be subdivided for a relative to 8 hectares (20 acres). The by-law amends by-law 42 by adding into Section 2.1 (8)

(e) to subdivisions for the provision of a residence for a relative under Section 996 of the Municipal Act provided the land is not within the Agricultural Land Reserve, has not been subdivided previously under Section 996 of the Municipal Act and has a minimum lot size of 8 hectares; such subdivision shall be subject to all the requirements of that Section.

(f) to subdivisions for the provision of a residence for a relative under Section 996 of the Municipal Act provided the land is within the Agricultural Land Reserve and has not been subdivided under Section 996 of the Municipal Act within the previous 5 year period.

DENMAN VIDEO UPDATE

#### D.I.R.C.S. RENOVATION PROJECT

For those of you who have not roamed through the community hall lately, a lot of changes are underway. The final design and drawings are complete, with the generous and expert help of Les Baker, a retired Denman Island architect. His support throughout this initial phase has enabled Victr Sylvan and I (as coordinators) to finalize plans that meet building and safety standards AND that creatively solve the dilemma of making changes to a building that has been changed and changed and changed over its 75 year history. Not an easy feat! In addition, the cost of architectural consultation off-island would have been in the thousands of dollars. We have nicknamed Les "The Prince".

The construction crew has been working hard. Wes Ritter, a new islander, is the supervisor. With the crew (Russ Stone, John Davies and Tim Wees) they are about to begin the most difficult and complex part of the building program - lifting 1/3 of the main hall roof and laying trusses to create the stage/performance centre. On the labour grant we are still able to hire one more crew member. Anyone on a U.I.C. claim interested in doing construction work, please call Victr (335-0842) or Leslie (335-2918) There is also a phone at the hall now (335-1074) and people are working there daily until December 31st.

The library has been packed into boxes and stored for a few months. The new preschool is almost finished with new windows and a sliding door onto the back deck. An outside storage area for tricycles is complete. With the final new paint job, school will again open for our youngest learners.

We are researching information on septic fields and wells. There are a lot of options and we want to choose one that works for the increasing population over time, and that is within our budget.

#### FUNDRAISING

We have had our first meeting and have some wonderful ideas for raising "community dollars". To receive Lottery monies, evidence of community contribution is required. We have \$3000 so far and hope to raise another \$12,000. This can be cash, donated labour or material.

Our first project will be SELLING CHAIRS. We are inviting islanders and friends to buy a chair for \$100. The chairs will be built on Denman, creating employment for two people. Anyone who buys a chair can have up to 25 letters printed on the back of the chair. One way to immortalize islanders and businesses who contribute! Think of it - your old business stamped in perpetuity when you sit down for a performance of Strauss at age 78! Your nickname stamped into a chair leaving everyone at the play guessing "Who IS that?" If you cannot afford \$100 on your own, can your neighbourhood pool money and buy one? Could be an interesting message on the back of that chair. Now, no fighting over who gets to sit in it! Can a group buy a chair?

#### DENMAN SENIORS



#### COMMUNITY HALL RENOVATION NEWS

Ah ... ahem ... Victr ... ya cut off too much! I told ya to just cut a hole for a skylight. I know the old hall used ta be dark, but isn't this a bit much?




As you have seen in passing by, the roof has been stripped off the community hall and the new trussed roof put in place. It took one week to complete the work with the help of an incredible team of volunteers and crew - every day for 7 days. We had cooks supplying lunch, clean-up crews sorting wood and keeping debris collected, roof walkers climbing around on the open trusses, designers consulting the plans, nailers tacking on new strapping and tin, and carpenters below supplying the cut materials. A big thanks goes out to those of the paid crew who worked 7-9 days straight, and to the volunteers who continued to reappear daily to finish the job before the BIG RAINS. (In this week of roofing, the volunteer contributions of labour totalled \$5229. This brings the money, labour and materials raised by Denman Islanders so far up to approximately \$9000. HOORAY!)

We still have a way to go. SO BUY THAT CHAIR!! Mike Comeau has donated his scalp by saying to Dave Pritchard. "If you guys can sell all 150 chairs, I'll get a mohawk haircut!" We have taken him up on the offer. IF ALL 150 CHAIRS ARE PURCHASED BY NOVEMBER 18th (OUR FUNDRAISING NIGHT), MIKE'S HAIRLINE WILL BE "RE-DESIGNED" that night! Remember, half your contribution will be set aside to buy a brand new hall chair (including 25 letters of "message" you wish embossed on the back of the chair). You can't afford \$100 you say? Then SHARE A CHAIR with your naighbours. Four households can chip in \$25 each and come up with a group message "from your neighbourhood to the community". The other half of your contribution will be spent on materials to finish the hall renovations. To meet public facility standards for fire safety, we have to install a fire alarm system. Unexpectedly, this is an added cost and we hope to raise the money for 10 mow. (So our goal has been increased to #20,000). To buy YOUR CHAIR, call Leslie at 335-2918.

#### An Open Letter to all Residents:

Denman Island residents will soon have a facility which will allow live theater and other such activities to be conducted in a space actually designed for such performances. Denman Island has in the past missed out on a large number of such activities, like the group that just played in Courtenay and on Hornby Island. The present DIRC's executive and the many volunteers have to be congratulated for taking on such a challenging task....the task of converting the old hall into a multi-use building, which will include a theater (complete with a sound booth and stage lighting.) Les Baker, Larry Lepore, Leslie Dunsmore and Victr Sylvan took on the task of designing the project with Leslie in charge of fund raising.

You may be wondering why I have taken the time to write this even before the work is completed. My reasons are many; however, as a resident and as chairperson for Denman Island Arts & Crafts Society, I see a great need for this type of facility on Denman. So much so, that I have gotten involved in helping raise the portion of the renovations costs not covered by grants.

For the new theater to be used to its full extent, the hall will need to have new chairs, approximately 150, to allow a full house-type environment for plays etc. To help raise the \$20000 needed to cover the grant shortfall, it has been decided to sell chairs at \$100 each, allowing the donor to have his/her name put on the chair. I have thrown my support behind this, as it will provide the needed money, as well as the chairs for the theater etc. To make it more fun I will allow myself to be given a MOHAWK hair cut on stage at an appropriate social function, (provided all 150 chairs are sold.) With over 350 families and appox. 1000 residents, it seems to me that the goal of 150 chairs should be within easy reach....anyone got a spare toupee they can lend me for a couple of months? If you cannot afford the full \$100, get together with a friend and I'm sure that pledges will be accepted. It was originally hoped that the

chairs could be produced here on the island, but it seems more cost effective to purchase ready made chairs at wholesale pricing.

As chairperson for DIACS, I have already spoken with an organizer of the Hornby Pestival to see about the feasibility of having some of the activities being scheduled for Denman as well as Hornby. I do not want to be in competition with them but due to the ferry service between our two islands we do miss out on some of these events. I do not know if anything will come of my contact with them, but I would love to see this type of entertainment here on Denman (year around.) So if you can help out in this chair sale please do ... in the long run we can all only benefit. Thanks Mike
